Meet your BHH Families

Sarah is 50 years old and was diagnosed with stage II breast cancer in June 2014. In a personal statement written to Bringing Hope Home, she says, "Before my diagnosis, I was on top of my household bills. Since starting treatment, I'm trying my best to work, stay afloat, and provide for my daughter. Thankfully, I haven't had too many side effects but on days I do, I have to miss work which means I don't get paid. I have a \$6,000/year deductible, which has been really difficult to keep up with. I appreciate anything you can do to help us out during this difficult time. **Because of the 2015 Brian Byrne Memorial Golf Outing, Bringing Hope Home was able to pay Sarah's electric, water, and car insurance.**

Pam is 49 years old and was diagnosed with stage IV pancreatic cancer in April 2015. In a personal statement to Bringing Hope Home, she says, "In February 2015, my husband had a heart attack, and then April 2015, I was diagnosed and began treatment. Then in September 2015, my husband got hurt at work and has been out since. Workman's Compensation took forever to start his checks, and my SSD doesn't cover much. Our bills are really behind, and I'm unable to do anything to help, due to my treatments. I would just like to open a bill one time and not see a shut off or eviction notice. I'm a fighter, and I don't give up. I would be so thankful for any help that you are able to give us." **Because of the 2015 Brian Byrne Memorial Golf Outing, Bringing Hope Home was able to pay Pam's mortgage, electric and provide gift cards for groceries.**
